

Competition Eligibility:

- Entrants must be fully paid up members of either the Chester Motor Club or the Liverpool Motor Club and be in possession of a valid current MSA Entrants licence.
- 1.3.2 Drivers and Entrant/Drivers must be fully paid up members of either the Chester Motor Club or Liverpool Motor Club, be registered for the Championship and be in possession of a valid MSA Competition (Non-Race National B or above) status licence.
- All necessary documentation must be presented for checking at all rounds when signing-on.
- Competitors in road going classes MUST complete an eligibility form before acceptance into the championship is granted. It would help organisers if other competitors would also return a completed form.

- 1.4.1 Apply by filling in the registration form attached to these regulations and sending it to the championship
- Entries will be confirmed and it is a condition of the Championship that at least two championship stickers are displayed on the competing vehicle at each qualifying round.
- There will be two Divisions.

Division 1: those who enter 7 or more events.

Division 2, those who enter a maximum of 6 events.

Entrants to Division 1 are not eligible for Division 2.

The registration fee is £17.00, in addition to the relevant Motor Club Membership fee. For Division 2 the registration fee is £15.00, in addition to the relevant Motor Club Membership fee.

1.4.4 A competitor who registers for Division 2 may nominate the 6 events which are to count. If no nominations are received by the Championship Co-ordinator before the start of the first counting event then the first six completed events will count. If a competitor competes in more than six events then only those nominated before the start of the first counting event, or the first six completed events where no nomination has been made, will count for championship scoring purposes.

A completed event is defined as an event where an entry is accepted and final results are published whether the competitor completes the event or not.

- After competing in their first event competitors may not change to another Division.
- Closing date: 1st July 2015

1.6 Championship Scoring:

- 1.6.1 Each car may only be entered in its correct class in accordance with the regulations of the meeting. The organisers of the Championship reserve the right to allocate the appropriate class for scoring purposes should it be necessary for whatever reason. For eligible Championship classes see section 1.7.1.6.2 Subject to section 1.6.1 cars will be scored in the Class in which they enter, however if classes are later merged by the organising club then points will be allocated as if that class was run separately.
- 1.6.3 When necessary to calculate scores the times set will be transposed to the appropriate class and points allocated as normal.
- 1.6.4 There will be two Divisions. Division 1; those who enter 7 or more events. Division 2, those who enter a maximum of 6 events. Entries to Division 1 are not eligible for Division 2 or vice versa.
- 1.6.5 Where a Championship round does not adhere to the Championship class structure or the technical regulations of the Championship classes, then points awarded to Championship drivers will be calculated, as far as practicable, as if though the Championship classes existed at that event.
- 1.6.6 Points scored in Division 1 will accrue from the contender's best performance in 9 events.
- 1.6.7 Points scored in Division 2 will accrue from the contender's performance in 5 events. First six events only to count.
- 1.6.8 Points will not be awarded retrospectively.
- 1.6.9 At all rounds the second fastest class time sets the bogey time from which points are calculated. These will be calculated as a percentage of that time, corrected to two decimal places. e.g. A second in class time of 87.90 secs scores 100 points, a time of 86.30 secs scores as follows: 87.90/86.30 x 100 = 101.85 points, and so on. Maximum points attainable are 103% of the second in class time, however if there are two or less competitors in a class then the maximum attainable is 101%. i.e. if there is only one in the class the score would be 100%
- 1.6.10 Points will be awarded to all drivers that set a time, only one score per event is acceptable
- 1.6.11 Ties will be resolved by counting most maximum scores then most scores of 99.99 then most scores of
- 1.6.12 An appeal against points awarded, or not awarded, in the Championship must be lodged in writing with the Championship Co-ordinator within 7 days of first publication of the points. MSA Bluebook Section C.6.5 applies.
- 1.6.13 Competitors are responsible for ensuring that their results are made available to the championship coordinator as soon as possible after each event.
- 1.6.14 To be eligible for awards competitors in Division 1 must complete at least 5 events and in Division 2 at least 3 events
- 1.6.15 No person may win more than one award. (except the winners of the Classic Car Championship and Top Ten Challenge)

1.7 Championship Eligible Classes

In accordance with the 2015 MSA Year Book, cars will be entered in the following classes which will be sub-divided according to the Northern Speed Classes: (see 4.0, 4.1)

Class 1 Road-going Series Production Cars conforming to Section S11 of the Year Book.

Class 2 Road-going Specialist Production Cars conforming to Section S11 of the Year Book.

Cars in classes 1 & 2 must be road legal and have a current tax disc or alternative proof, insurance and (if required) an MOT. Tyres for Class 1 & 2 as per North & Midland Speed Classes.

Class 3 Modified Series Production & Specialist Cars conforming to Section S12 of the Year Book.

Class 4 Sports Libre Cars conforming to Section S14 of the Year Book including Hillclimb Super Sports Cars conforming to Section S13 of the Year Book

Class 5 Racing Cars conforming to Section S15 of the Year Book

1.8 Equivalence

1.9 Classic Road Cars and Classic Racing Cars

- 1.9.1 There will be awards for road cars first registered on or before 1st January 1985 and racing cars built before that date (as evidenced by the vehicle's registration document or log book). Road cars must be completely road legal and come with a current MOT, Insurance & tax where required. (The competitor shall be responsible for demonstrating eligibility and the evidence must be made available to the championship Eligibility Scrutineer when requested)
- 1.9.2 Scoring: The difference between the fastest and slowest timed runs will count as points scored. Points will accrue from the best 5 scores of the first 6 events completed. Competitors with the lowest overall score will be declared winners of the trophies, see section 1.10. Awards. If only one time is recorded then a score of 2.5 will be given which will also be the maximum score allowed. For each event completed fewer than the required number of five a score of 2.5 shall be added.

.10 Top Ten Challenge (Supported by 24/7 Roller Shutters & Garage Doors)

- 1.10.1 Competitors are automatically entered into the Challenge when registering for the championship.
- 1.10.2 On the day of the event entered the fastest REGISTERED competitor would get 10 points, second fastest 9 points and so on down to the tenth fastest who would get 1 point.
- 1.10.3 All official timed runs to count with the competitor's best time being taken as their counting time.

Clarifications for Road-going Series Production Cars 5.0

5 1 Classes SA, SB & SC

All cars must have current VED Disc, Receipt of Payment or a recent copy of the DVLA enquiry website (www.vehicleenguiry.service.gov.uk/), a current MOT if age requires it, & insurance in the name of the driver. It is the driver's responsibility to prove compliance.

These classes are intended to attract new inexperienced drivers, using cars with very few modifications (as listed), to encourage low-cost entry into the sport, All cars running in the above classes must remain in totally road legal form at all times.

All cars must have current VED & insurance in the name of the main driver, with a current MOT if

Note, Trade plates and traders or company group insurance policies will not be accepted.

Wheels & Tyres; Only standard* width wheel rims may be used. Tyres must be from MSA list 1A and be Road Legal.

Engine, Induction & Exhaust; The air cleaner and exhaust system must remain as production or OEM pattern replacement including catalyst if fitted.

Suspension: Non-adjustable uprated dampers may be fitted.

Brakes; An alternative or OEM pattern replacement brake friction material can be fitted, but modifications to the brake discs, drums or calipers are not permitted.

Body: In the interests of safety front seats may be replaced by competition versions which must be fully trimmed, not a bare shell. Loose over-mats may be removed but the original carpets, fixed floor mats, and floor trim, etc, must remain and in their original locations. All fittings e.g. electric windows etc must be in working condition. Pyrotechnic safety devices such as airbags and seatbelt pretensioners may be disconnected or removed.

General; The spare wheel and any mounting or cover which is not permanently fixed to the body may be

No other modifications, except the fitting of a roll cage, are allowed in classes SA, SB and SC.

Sports Cars. Kit cars. limited production cars, space framed or non-ferrous chassis construction road cars. and one-off road-going cars are not permitted in Classes SA. SB and SC.

In the event of an unresolved eligibility issue, the driver of the car concerned may be required to produce within four weeks of the event in question, a manufacturer's catalogue to substantiate any queried modifications / specifications and allow championship points to stand.

Any modifications not specifically permitted are, by definition, not allowed.

* "Standard" means components that were listed in the manufacturer's price list for that model of car.

Classes 1A to 1E

Tyres: Classes 1A, 1B & 1C must use tyres from MSA list 1A, (1D, 1E, 1F & 1G may use list 1B tyres) and must be Road Legal.

Exhaust systems; must include a working catalytic converter on all cars manufactured after 31st December 1999.

Brakes; Brake calipers, discs, master cylinder, shoes & pads can be modified. Carbon discs are not permitted. Modification of the brake pedal is permitted. Brake bias adjustment is allowed. The fitting of aftermarket pedal assemblies is not permitted.

Anti-Lock braking systems can be removed but cannot be added to a vehicle that does not have one as a manufacturer specified option.

Suspension;

Non-adjustable Strut Braces across the top of the front suspension turrets are allowed but these must be removable and not welded in place..

Safety; Pyrotechnic safety devices such as airbags and seatbelt pre-tensioners may be disconnected or removed.

Otherwise as specified in Section S11.

The requirements of the current MSA regulations with regards to safety provisions for Sprint and Hillclimb cars and requirements of Classes 1 A-E must be adhered to.

Classes 2A to 2D

Tyres must be from MSA list 1A or 1B, and be Road Legal

Exhaust systems must include a working catalytic converter on all cars manufactured after 31st December

All other classes as specified in Section S

Please Note: Scrutineers and Championship Officials reserve the right to check all road-going competition vehicles' taxation status via the DVLA website to ensure compliance with championship

It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that all data held by the DVLA is accurate for the vehicle being entered into competition

- 1.10.4 In the event of a tie between two competitors at an event then their second best times would be used to determine the order.
- 1.10.5 Anyone not REGISTERED would be excluded from (a) scoring any points or (b) affecting the points scored by slower or faster registered competitors.
- 1.10.6 All events the Chester Motor Club & Liverpool Motor Club organised events listed are to count as rounds of the Top Ten Challenge to give a maximum of seven scores.

- Classes: The classes will be as specified in Section 1.7 3.2
- 3.3 Safety Requirements: All vehicles must comply with MSA General, Technical and Safety Regulations.
- A driver may only compete in a maximum of two different cars in different classes throughout the Championship season. The 'first car' will be considered as the one in the class detailed on the Championship Registration Form. The 'second car', if in a different class from the 'first car', may only

score Championship points at a maximum of two Championship rounds in Division 1, or only one Championship round in the case of Division 2.

If the 'second car' is used in more rounds than stipulated above then the additional outings will be discounted for Championship scoring purposes.

There is no restriction on the use of multiple cars within the original class that is declared on the Championship Registration Form.

Club Members wishing to enter the Championship should complete the attached application form and send it to the Championship Co-ordinator with the appropriate fee.

4.0 North & Midland Speed Classes

You must be able to produce proof of current Road Tax, Insurance and MOT certificate (where applicable) at Scrutineering. Proof of Road Tax will be via VED Tax Disc, taxation receipt or a Vehicle Enquiry using the DVLA enquiry website (www.vehicleenquiry.service.gov.uk/). Classes SA to SC & 1A to 1C must use MSA List 1A tyres, Classes 1D to 1G may use List 1B tyres.

- All vehicles must comply with MSA Technical Regulations and with the specific regulations for each category/class as specified in S10. See the 2015 Competitors & Officials Yearbook Section B for the definition of a Sports Car.
- 4.7 (All Classes) Cars must have towing points as described in S10.1.15 at both front & rear. A suitable point on the roll hoop will generally suffice for open single seater and open sports racing cars.
- 4.8 Equivalence factors are as per S10.3.1, S10.3.2 with the addition of non-forced induction diesel engines x 0.714 and forced induction diesel engines x 1.4.
